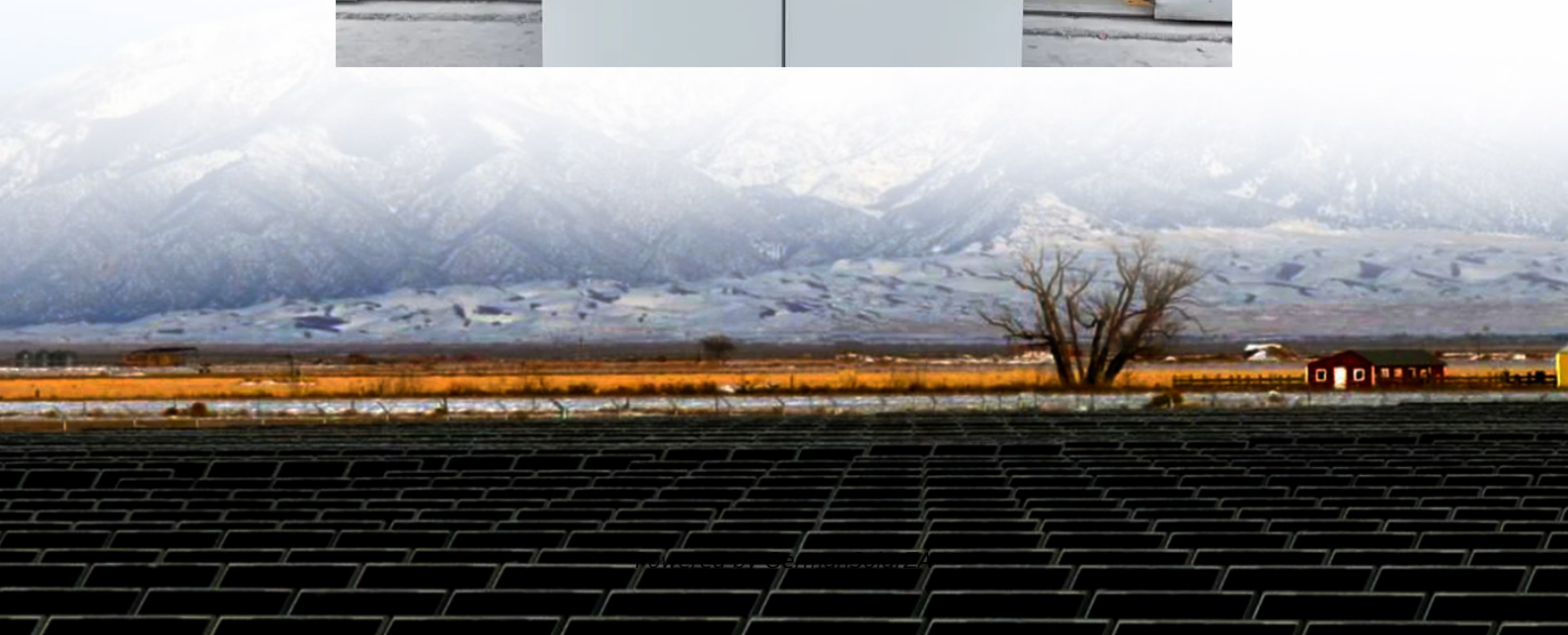

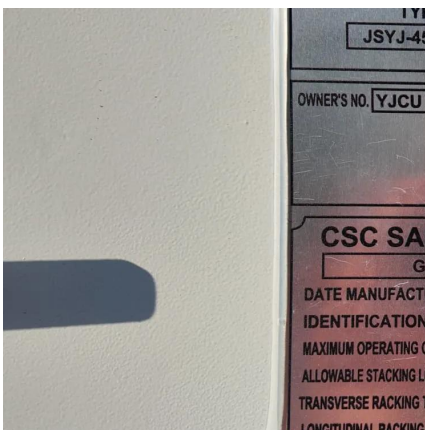
Nxa and nxe in uninterruptible power supply



batch file

Using the FOR command modifiers %%~nxa then grabs the last section of the path. I have not directly tested the code myself but have used this technique in the past. You ...

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Pull filenames using .bat

```
C:\Customers> for /f "@delims=" %%a in ('dir /s /b /a-d *.*') do @echo %%~nxa >> outputfile.txt
```

Directly into command prompt and it outputs the filenames in all the sub ...

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Get current folder name by a DOS command?

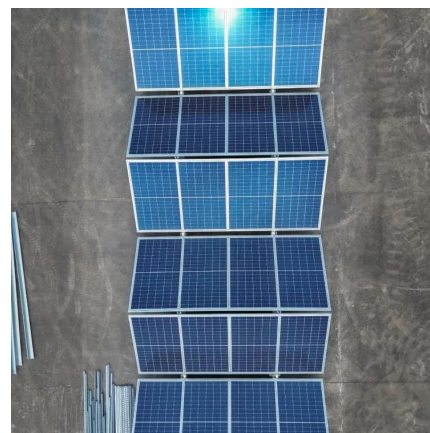

Omit the `/S` If there are files in subdirs with the same name how would you distinguish them? Otherwise parse `dir` output with a `for /f` and use the `~nx` modifier to return ...

I am making a batch program that will create a settings file after execution. I want the name of the settings file (excluding the extension) to be drawn from the scripts file ...

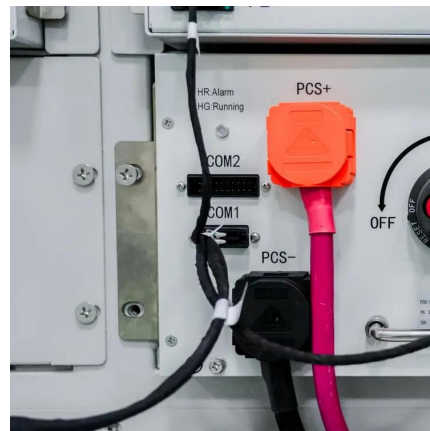
